STABILITY FIRST

OUR MISSION:

Stability First is a Christian non-profit organization established to address multiple issues related to the alleviation of poverty. We provide housing, substance abuse recovery programming and support services, and many other resources geared toward assisting those with limited resources by increasing their financial stability and self-sufficiency.

OUR MINISTRIES:

THE MAGDALENE HOUSE is a facility for women without dependents, established to meet the needs of homeless women in Morgan County and Central Indiana. It provides housing and supportive services for up to 16 women. Our goal is to walk alongside women as they gain the stability needed to live on their own. The program is faith-based and focused on an individualized, goal oriented process.

FOUNDATIONS is a non-residential program providing spiritual mentoring, goal setting & accountability tools and life coaching for men. Stability First envisions a residential program reinforcing these goals in the very near future, as God provides.

THE LYNAY CENTER is a multi-purpose facility housing additional services addressing poverty issues in Morgan County. Programming includes men's outreach coaching sessions, recovery group meetings, small group Bible studies, counseling sessions, and educational, job & career exploration opportunities.

MAGGIE BAGS is an entrepreneurial support ministry. The efforts of Magdalene House residents are combined with volunteer seamstresses to create beautiful women's cross-body shoulder bags and convenient zipper pouches in designer fabrics. Shelter residents learn sewing skills along with valuable job skills such as accountability, teamwork and pride in achieving goals. Dear Stability First Supporters and Friends,

When I first heard of the Magdalene House I was in the Morgan County Jail. It was the other females there that told me about the opportunities and resources the Magdalene House helps women. I thought just how much I could really use the support and I really needed this in my life. Upon my release, I made it through the intake process and felt immediately welcomed. My then boyfriend showed up and with hesitation in my heart I ended up leaving with him. Well, it wasn't long after that, that I found myself doing the same things I swore I was done with, and ultimately digging myself into an even deeper hole. I went through Treatment at Tara in Ninevah near Franklin and served a few more months at the county jail for probation violation. Upon my release this time, I had my mind made up I knew where I was going. As a matter of fact, my action plan when I was in Tara was to go to the Magdalene House, it was my safe place.

Due to the Pandemic, they had to get it approved to get me in. Luckily, Churches in Mission paid for me to stay the night in a hotel. All night long I prayed, "God, your will, not mine". That night I could have done anything, gave up hope, but instead I had faith, a mustard seed of faith. By God's grace the next morning I woke up and a great friend picked me up, we called, and the house manager said "yes, I could come", I cried, this was my chance, my chance to build me back up to grow with my walk with Christ and build a foundation.

The structure the Magdalene House provides is huge and was exactly what I needed in my life. With the morning devotions to help set the tone for the day, to the budgeting to help keep me on track with saving money and contributing to cost sharing. Most importantly we set weekly goals to help us stay focused and stay on track of the things we need in order to succeed.

While at the Magdalene House I was able complete IOP through Center Stone, received Resident of the Month the second month I was there. I went from riding a bike to and from work to getting a car. I went from doing video visits with my sons, to now getting my youngest every other weekend and every Wednesday and well and getting some much-needed time with my oldest son who lives with my parents in Ohio. I am gaining trust from those I love but also learning to love myself. I am learning I am capable of so much more than I ever gave myself credit for. I have worked hard to get to where I am today. I am finally living life instead of just surviving, and its only just begun. I have since moved out on my own. I was blessed to have the help of Rapid Rehousing along with the support of many others in our community. I also work at PacMoore and absolutely love my job.

This is a wonderful place, it has helped me in so many ways, the staff is amazing, loving and kind. They are all different yet all work as servant of Christ and are truly here for their passion and love to help us thrive. I come here often to see the ladies and the staff. We eat dinner and I especially enjoy our Sunday morning church time. I've developed some long lasting relationships with some very close friends but most of all it's helped to draw me closer to God.

2020 Highlights

2020 was a year of tremendous challenges, and also wonderful blessings! Despite seven weeks of a mandated COVID lockdown, and another sixteen weeks of quarantine, our Magdalene House safely sheltered and served 75 women, providing 4,193 nights of shelter in a time of unprecedented need and uncertainty. We are deeply indebted to shelter Director, Julie VanWinkle, who stayed in the shelter throughout the sixteen day quarantine, sparing other staff members and serving the ladies with great love and concern.

We are thankful that our Maggie Bags had an established online presence, as Boutique sales and in-person work at the center was curtailed for much of 2020. During the Spring months the Magdalene House ladies moved sewing machines to the house and began making face masks which were distributed to hospitals and nursing care facilities. Despite many challenges, community volunteers and Magdalene House residents logged 1,980 volunteer hours, many of them from home, selling 1,087 bags.

Recovery Group meetings met in-person for only 23 weeks (46 sessions) but still served 72 individuals, including important over the phone contact with those most in need of positive reassurance.

Throughout the year God provided for our every need. Rally in the Valley runners and walkers did so virtually. We hosted our Annual Gala virtually and have had over 1,800 people hear the stories shared that night. Even as we navigated new territory, our donors and partners were faithful supporters. We so are grateful for each one!

As God provided for current ministry needs, He also continually encouraged us as we pursued plans to expand our Foundations Men's Ministry. A significant estate gift from a dear friend to this ministry, Mary Faucett, was designated for the purchase of property and/or facilities to house and serve men. We continue to ask for God's provision of every detail and all of the needed resources, expecting Him to provide.

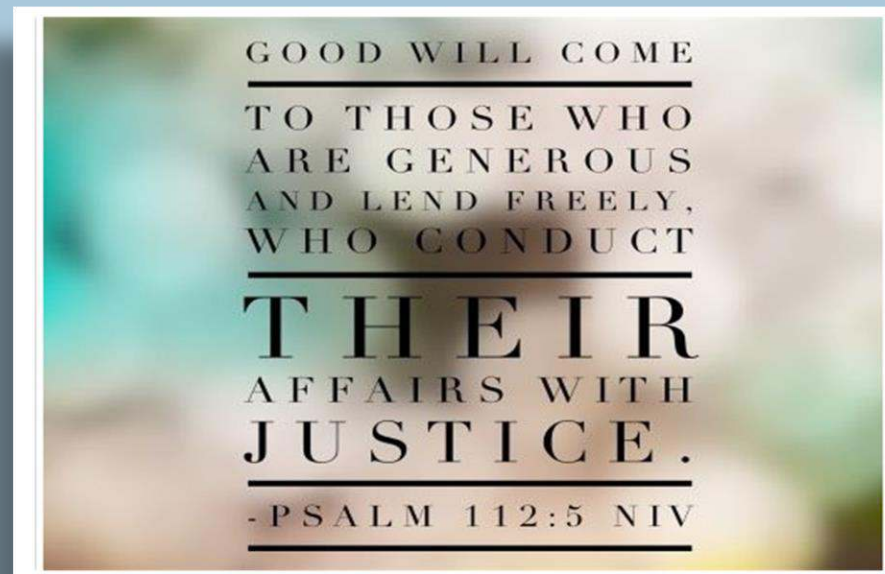
